Employee and Supervisor Interaction in three COVID Exposure scenarios. This document expires on 8/15/2020

COVID POSTIVE§

- Do NOT go to work
- Contact Supervisor
- Follow CDC/ADH guidelines for self-quarantine (14 days after exposure) or until you receive a negative test if past the 14 days and still positive
- Consult and follow PCP healthcare guidelines
- Follow CDC/ADH guidelines for isolation
- Provide COVID positive test results to supervisor
- Provide return-to-work document from PCP or ADH to supervisor (or consult ADH) and develop a return-to-work plan
- Return to work when approved by supervisor

§Definition: a positive test for COVID-19 confirmed by ADH and/or lab notification.

COVID Exposure‡

- Do NOT go to work
- Contact Supervisor
- Follow CDC/ADH guidelines for self-quarantine (14 days after exposure)
- Consult PCP and seek COVID test
- If COVID positive, see guidelines in COVID POSITIVE column
- If COVID negative, continue self-quarantine for 14 days after exposure or current CDC/ADH guidelines
- After 14-day quarantine is complete, contact supervisor to develop a return-to-work plan
- Return-to-work when approved by supervisor

‡Definition: ≥15 minutes close contact (< 6 ft) with a person that has tested COVID+ or is being tested for COVID and is awaiting test results. CDC definition at

Secondary COVID Exposure[†]

- Do NOT go to work
- Contact Supervisor
- Return to work when approved by supervisor

[†]Definition: ≥15 minutes close contact (< 6 ft) with a person that has been in close contact with a person who tested COVID+. Secondary Exposure is a term developed for internal use; NOT A CDC/ADH term.

Instructions for Supervisors

COVID POSTIVE§

- Do not share names of individuals involved with other employees
- Inform HR and unit head immediately to vet the response plan
- Instructions to employee:
 - Do not return to work until further instructions
 - Begin CDC/ADH guidelines for self-quarantine (14 days after exposure)
 - Provide COVID positive test results to supervisor
 - Provide return-to-work letter to supervisor
 - Return to work only after approved by supervisor
- Contact tracing: Work with the employee to establish a list of employees who received primary and secondary exposure. Follow COVID Exposure instructions for each affected employee
- Facilities: May require a temporary facility closure or complete cleaning and disinfecting

†Definition: ≥15 minutes close contact (< 6 ft) with a person that has been in close contact with a person who tested COVID+. Secondary Exposure is a term developed for internal use; NOT A CDC/ADH term.

COVID Exposure‡

- Do not share names of individuals involved with other employees

- Instructions to employee:
 - Do not return to work until further instructions
 - Begin CDC/ADH guidelines for self-quarantine (14 days after exposure)

 - Contact supervisor as soon as test results are available
 - Return to work only after approved by supervisor
- Contact tracing: Work with the employee to establish a list of employees who received secondary exposure. Follow Secondary COVID Exposure instructions for each affected employee
- Test results:
- Negative test: allow employee to return after the 14-day quarantine window
- Positive test: Follow COVID positive instructions
- Facilities: May require a temporary facility closure or complete cleaning and disinfecting

‡Definition: ≥15 minutes close contact (< 6 ft) with a person that has tested COVID+ or is suspected of being COVID+.

Secondary COVID Exposure[†]

- Do not share names of individuals involved with other employees
- Inform HR and unit head immediately to vet the response plan
- Instructions to employee:
 - Do not return to work until further instructions
- Return to work only after approved by supervisor
- Contact tracing: with secondary exposures, no further actions are necessary
- Test results:
 - Negative test: if tested, allow employee to return even if the return date is within the 14-day quarantine window
 - Positive test: Follow COVID positive instructions
