## Arkansas Humanities Council: R.E.A.C.H. Grants

**Deadlines: 1st of every month (\$3,000 limit)**

The project must have a strong humanities component and must include one or more of the following: language studies, history, anthropology, archeology, social studies, ethics, English language arts, English as a Second Language (ESL), English Language Learners (ELL), and literacy.

## CARNEGIE CORP: Grantmaking Program Grants

**Deadlines: Continuous**

Themes: Education; democracy; higher ed & research in Africa...

## Clif Bar Family Foundation

**Deadlines: Quarterly - 2/1; 6/1; 10/1**

Priority is given to applicants that address the funding priorities: Protect Earth's beauty and bounty; Create a robust, healthy food system; Increase opportunities for outdoor activity; Reduce environmental health hazards; Build stronger communities.

## White County United Way Community Relief Grant

**Deadlines: by 10<sup>th</sup> of each month**

The special funds will be used to boost efforts of human and social service nonprofit in White, Jasper, and Pulaski counties on the frontlines of the Covid-19 pandemic. The White County United Way Community Relief Fund application is now available for eligible non-profit organizations to apply for relief due to COVID-19. Any non-profit social service organization in White, Jasper, or Pulaski counties that may be suffering the immediate physical, social, and economic effects of the COVID-19 pandemic may apply for assistance through this grant.

## Community Foundation of Pulaski County Grants

**Deadlines: 3/1; 7/1; 11/1**

*Community Grants* – for organizations seeking grants of up to \$15,000 for projects in one of the four areas of aspiration as described in the Community Conversations report: forward thinking leadership; safe and drug-free; thriving and growing; welcoming and open-minded.

*Field of Interest Grants* – three grants are available for specific charitable purposes: adult education; educationally disadvantaged children/adults; wildlife conservation and education. Grant amounts vary.

*Sustainability Grants* - for 501(c)(3) organizations who wish to create their own endowment fund in the Community Foundation. A \$5,000 matching grant can enable an organization to establish a \$10,000 permanent endowment and provide a stable source of income for its mission.

## **Delta Dental Mini Grants**

**Open (\$2,500)**

Mini grants to support innovative, solution-based projects that make an impact in the field of oral health. Directly impact communities providing access to funding for organizations that may not meet the requirements of our Community Grants.

## **Doris Day Animal Foundation**

**Deadlines: January, April, July, October**

For organizations that need assistance in their work of caring for and protecting animals. Through our grants, scores of animal rescue and welfare organizations have received sustaining resources to continue their work, to offer additional services or to expand their reach to the animals who most critically need their help.

## **ENTERGY: Micro-Grants Program**

**Deadlines: Continuous**

Community-focused; funding for smaller projects/organizations in the areas where Entergy conducts business.

## **Farm Bureau AR: Garden Grants**

**Deadlines: Open 11/1 to 2/15**

**(Guidelines)** The Outdoor Classroom Garden Mini-Grant Program is designed to show that agriculture is an integral part of our everyday environment. Farms, wildlife, forestry, people and cities are all interrelated with agriculture. As most of Arkansas' wildlife resides on and feeds off of private property, including farms and timberlands, the gardens can demonstrate the connection between agriculture, food, fiber, conservation, wildlife and the urban environment.

## **Finra Investor Education Foundation**

**Deadlines: Continuous**

Funds research and educational projects that empower underserved Americans with the knowledge, skills and tools to make sound financial decisions throughout life.

## **Foundation for the Mid-South**

**Deadlines: Continuous (3 stages: concept, pre-proposal, full-proposal)**

Our mission is to improve lives by expanding knowledge. We support efforts that create high-quality education, initiatives that encourage physical and mental health, resources that promote financial security and solutions that enable communities to grow and prosper.

## **Fruit Tree Planting Foundation**

**Deadlines: Continuous/Rolling**

Our orchard donations are available for recipients who pledge to care for their trees and utilize them for a charitable purpose. If selected for an orchard donation, FTPF provides high-quality fruit trees and shrubs, equipment, on-site orchard design expertise and oversight, horticultural workshops, and aftercare training and manuals. We subsidize deer fencing and drip irrigation as needed, and incorporate these installations into the event day. FTPF also helps coordinate all aspects of the planting, and offers an inspirational, educational experience for volunteers interested in learning more about trees.

## **Inerconnection.org Computer Grants**

**Deadlines: February 28, May 31, August 31, and November 30**

Computer grants are awarded to organizations that deliver necessary and valuable services to underserved communities like technology training, health care, education, and job training, but need upgraded computers to better manage their organization and improve their capacity to deliver those valuable services.

## **Karma For Cara Foundation Microgrants**

**Deadlines: January 1; April 1; October 1**

Grants ranging between \$250 and \$1,000 to USA children and youth, ages 18 and under, to complete community service projects in their communities. Funding will be provided to support a wide variety of projects and events.

### **Kaboom Community Built Playgrounds**

#### **Deadlines: Continuous**

KaBOOM! offers two different grants to help groups build playgrounds: (1) Build it with KaBOOM! (Grantees receive a custom-designed playspace: play equipment, safety surfacing, site enhancement projects. Grantees must raise \$8,500 towards the cost of the playground equipment. (2) Build it Yourself (Grantees are awarded a \$15,000 grant to be used toward the purchase of playground equipment. Grantees must raise at least \$9,000, for a total project value of \$24,000). ### **OGE FOUNDATION: Foundation Grants**

#### **Deadlines: Continuous**

Grants to (western) Arkansas and Oklahoma nonprofit organizations and K-12 schools to benefit communities where the funding source has a business presence (western AR). Funding is intended to support institutions, organizations, and programs that improve the quality of life and economic well-being of eligible communities.

#### **Deadlines: Continuous**

### **Our Military Kids Activity Programs Grant**

#### **Deadlines: Continuous**

Grants of up to \$300 to USA families of active overseas military personnel (including national guard deployed and reserves) and severely injured service members or veterans to support their children's participation in recreational programs and camps. Funding is intended for a range of activities such as sports, fine arts, camps, tutoring, driver education, high school band trips, STEM programs, and more. Eligible children are those that are at least five years old through high school graduation.

### **US Venture/Schmidt Family Foundation**

#### **Deadline: 1/15; 4/1; 7/15; 10/15**

Program Grants will be awarded from the U.S. Venture/Schmidt Family Foundation (USV/SFF) to help the disadvantaged, improve the quality of people's lives, and strengthen our communities. Funding priority areas: Education; Jobs & Economy; Family Support & Social Connectedness; Physical Health; Psychological Health & Addiction; Human Services; Other.
